




WE SHARE THE LAND DIARY

We're also convinced that foreign languages and cultures gave a greater confidence, opened mind and will enhance employability.
















SECOND MOBILITY FRANCE LEAP ST CYRAN DU JAMBOT 14-18 October 2019







... For many of us it was our first experience with planes and flights. We were so excited about it. We were in France – can you believe this? How lucky we were :)



It was such an exciting and busy day. At the end of the day there was a dinner with school teachers and French specialities. We could laugh, talk and dance of course...






































































... That day we had to wake up really early because of the attractions planned for us. We went for a guided trip to Chambord castle.
